CANP 3 Southeast Asia (2013)



The Capacity and Networking Project (CANP) is a development project of the International Commission of Mathematical Instruction (ICMI) supported by the International Mathematical Union (IMU), UNESCO and the International Council for Science (ICSU) as well as regional governments and institutions.

The project is focused on providing teacher-educators in developing countries with enhanced mathematical and

Main outcomes:

The Workshop produced three outputs: a regional report, a vision for the future and plans for follow-up activities in 2014. The members from each participating country prepared a report on the state of mathematics education in their country which will be combined into a Regional Report that will be published in the CANP series in 2014.

Participants also produced a Vision for the Future document focusing on secondary mathematics education. This document will be published as Part Two of the Regional Report.

Current projects:

Plans were made to meet in 2014. In addition the infrastructure of a regional network was established and inter-country visits planned.
