1. Decisions from CDC- Meeting in March 2021

a) On October 10, 2021, CDC decided by e-mail vote to open a new call for project support (with a total budget of 50.000 Euros) with the similar conditions as the previous one for projects that should start between July 1, 2022 and June 30, 2023. The maximum amount to be awarded to each application is 10.000€. The deadline for applications is January 31, 2022.

b) Virtual Volunteer Lecturers Program. After e-mail discussion about the proposal received from Carlos and Helge about a new strand of the current VLP consisting in online lectures, CDC has approved on November 21, 2021 the following:

1) To launch a pilot project whose exact rules and duration will be defined in the coming CDC Meeting.

2) To entrust the VLP subcommittee with a proposal by February 15, 2022, to be included in the Agenda of the CDC Meeting.

3) To appoint Michel Waldschmidt as a member of the VLP subcommittee.

2. Follow-up of decisions

a) Changes in the programs to adapt to the situation created by CoviD19.

In respect to all the new rules for the programs decided during the March Meeting, Lena and Vanessa jointly with Alf and Olga have sorted out the operational aspects, implemented the needed changes on the website and application and report forms, informed the applicants and spreading information. The current wording of the calls can be seen in the folder "CDC Programs (2021)" in CDC internal site.

b) Dipendra's initiative (approved by CDC in the 2021 Meeting) proposing the ICM2022 LOC to support (in the same conditions as Chebyshev grants) all the 36 panel members got a positive reaction from the IMC organisers.

c) CDC activity in the ICM2022

I have contacted with the Local Organisers to propose the activity that has been approved. We are only pending of LOC deciding the final grid to know the date and time of the CDC discussion panels.

I have explored with IMU General Secretary, Lena and Scott the possibility of CDC temporarily employing additional administrative assistance for this activity from March 1 till July 31 and this question has been also positively solved.

d) CDC Communication.

Vanessa has updated the CDC Flyers and we have made them easy to download by a link on the first page of the CDC website. We have reorganised the banners and the sliders to make the CDC programs (and the sponsors) more visible it this first page.

We have tried to reinforce communication by e-mail and Facebook as well as by the insertions in the IMU-Newsletter.

e) Cooperation with ICTP.

As a continuation of the March joint Meeting, a working group composed by Alf, Andrea, Dipendra, Luigi, Olga, Ramadas, Emanuel Carneiro and Claudio Arezzo has been discussing about the different possible cooperation scenarios, mainly by mail with a zoom meeting on December 9, 2021. The conclusions are in the Annex.

3. News and updates

a) Chebyshev Grants.

By the end of the initial deadline for applications, the organisers extended it till May 1 2021, with applications received before this date being given priority.

Finally the number of applications has been of about 1.800.

On October 17, 2021 we have received the sad news of Charles Chidume passed away recently. Chidume was the chair of the African Panel in charge of evaluating Chebyshev grants. Julia Pestova has suggested (and Dipendra and myself have agreed) to appoint Nouzha El Jacoubi (which was a member of the Panel) as the new chair so that the panel can resume (or perhaps start) the very urgent evaluation task as soon as possible. The evaluation of the African Panel was completed by 1 December.

b) Donation received.

In September 2021 IMU-CDC has received an unexpected one-time donation, more precisely: Donation from the fundraiser for pure mathematics at Leicester University, UK of £23024.68, (27.000 €).

4. Updates about the CDC Programs

a) Conferences Support Program

From the 27 conferences awarded in 2020, 14 of them have been cancelled (approx. amount of $25.000 \notin$) Five conferences have been postponed.

All the conferences that took place (8) were in hybrid format. All grantees, except one, made use of the funds granted partially for equipment and services to conduct the activities online.

From the 8 visits awarded in 2020, 1 has been cancelled, 3 have taken place:
