Report:

Our main activity is supporting scholars, especially early career scholars or scholars from under-developed countries, to organise and to attend international conferences. In addition we provide grants to early career scholars for individual projects, such as archive visits or digitisation. We also provide support for history of mathematics initiatives within mathematics, such as special sessions within mathematics conferences or international lecture series.

In 2024 we have supported two specialist history of mathematics conferences, including the Novembertagung which is a conference for and organised by early career researchers in history of mathematics. https://drive.google.com/file/d/16fDjpQxsXUBO3G4zj_a2-rhTnEKO_5KV/view

We sponsored a Summer School at ICMS in Edinburgh on "Current research on the history of mathematics: new questions and new approaches" which was exclusively for ECRs.

We were joint organisers of a panel on translation at the European Congress of Mathematics in Seville in July.

Together with the International Academy for History of Science and the Institute for Advanced Study, Princeton, we organised an online lecture and panel discussion on the history of 'big mathematics' in September.

We have awarded three individual grants to early-career scholars, two of whom were speaking at the BSHM Research in Progress meeting in Oxford in March.

Future plans

We are sponsoring four symposia at the ICHST in Dunedin. We will be awarding funding to facilitate attendance at the Congress by ECRs, unemployed scholars and other disadvantaged groups. One symposium has five eligible scholars hoping to attend in person and one symposium has three eligible scholars hoping to attend in person. We will do what we can to support all these scholars but we will only be able to cover a small proportion of their expenses.

The ICHST is where we hold our open meeting and award our prizes – the May Medal & Prize to senior scholars and the Montucla Prize to ECRs. We hope that the prize-winners will be able to travel to Dunedin to receive their prizes and have set aside funds for this purpose, although it is unlikely that we will be able to cover all expenses for all prize-winners – it will largely depend on where they live.

Nevertheless, we have been able to set aside more funds for participation in the 2025 ICHST than previous ICHSTs due to having greater reserves as a result of the cancellation of the in-person ICHST in 2021.

In 2025 we anticipate supporting the 2025 Novembertagung, as well as making grants to individual ECRs. We will also support an international workshop on global histories and material cultures of accountancy and metrology should the application to ICMS in Edinburgh for the workshop be successful.

This is as much as we know at present, but doubtless other calls for our support will emerge as time progresses.
