The ICHM's bank account has been shifted successfully from Denmark to Germany and integrated into the IMU's financial structure. This has the advantage that the ICHM account will not have be set up anew when the ICHM treasurer changes.

Conferences

Five symposia at the joint **BSHM-CSHPM/SCHPM** Conference "People, Places, Practices", St. Andrews, Scotland, UK in July 2021 (postponed from July 2020 due to Covid-19). Each of these symposia is organized by an early career scholar and includes early career scholars among the speakers. http://www.mcs.st-andrews.ac.uk/bshm-cshpm/index.shtml

It is anticipated that the organizers of the 32nd Novembertagung to be held in in November 2021 will approach the ICHM for funding support. (See below for information about the Novembertagung.)

On the assumption that it will be possible to hold face-to-face conferences in 2021, it is anticipated that there will be other requests for funding from early career scholars (whose travel budgets are likely to be reduced).

The Novembertagung, which is organised by early career scholars for early career scholars, is held every year in a different country. We consider this to be one of the most important meetings supported by the ICHM as it enables early career scholars to make contact with one another at an international level as well as having the opportunity to present their work in a supportive environment.

Due to Covid-19, many early career scholars have been denied the opportunity to participate in face-to-face conferences, and helping with funding their attendance at such conferences is usually the main way in which the ICHM offers them support. At the forthcoming online Novembertagung 2020, we will be announcing to early career scholars the availability of ICHM funding for support in different ways, such as childcare grants for attendance at online conferences, cost of scans from overseas archives, etc.

We anticipate funding early career scholars for other online conference registration fees, as well as other expenses connected to such conferences, such as childcare, as well as other international research efforts, such as the scanning of archival documents.

Should it be possible to hold face-to-face conferences in 2021, it is anticipated that there will be requests for funding for travel from early career scholars (whose travel budgets are likely to be reduced).
