
Report of the ICHM to the IMU 2018-2022

June Barrow-Green (Chair)

From April 2018 to April 2022, the International Commission for the History of Mathematics (ICHM) has continued to pursue its dual aims of encouraging the study of the history of mathematics and of promoting a high level of historically and mathematically sophisticated scholarship in the field internationally. It has done so in the following ways:

Meetings of the Executive Committee (EC) of the ICHM

The EC meets at least four times yearly via e-mail to discuss matters of interest to the international history of mathematics community. Among the business discussed and the issues considered over the four-year period from 2018 to April 2022 were:

the implementation of an ICHM early career grant scheme; nominations to the Council of the Division of History of Science of the International Union of History of Philosophy of Science and Technology; the archives of the Institut Mittag-Leffler; the renewal and election of new officers and members of the Executive Council of the ICHM, as well as the appointment of national representatives to the ICHM; the approval each year of conferences and symposia for ICHM co-sponsorship (see below); the organization of symposia for the 26th ICHSTM (2020-2021); consideration and discussion of annual reports submitted by the Treasurer of the ICHM and the consideration and discussion of annual reports submitted by the editors of the ICHM's journal *Historia Mathematica*; the editorial transition of *Historia Mathematica*; the selection of the tenth Kenneth O. May Medallists and the selection of the fourth Montucla Prize winners (2020-21); symposium on history of mathematics for the 2022 ICM; the migration of the ICHM bank account from Denmark to Germany.

Publications

Historia Mathematica is the official journal of the ICHM. It appears four times annually and publishes roughly 525 pages of original research in the history of mathematics from all times and cultures. From 2018 to 2021, it was edited by Reinhard Siegmund-Schultze (Norway) and Nathan Sidoli (Japan). From 2021 has been edited by Antoni Malet (Spain) and Nathan Sidoli (Japan). It is published by Elsevier Science.

Medals and Prizes

The **Kenneth O. May Prize** is awarded every four years to a historian or historians in recognition of distinguished contributions to the history of mathematics. The Prize is administered by the ICHM.

Kenneth Ownsworth May (1915-1977) was a distinguished American mathematician and historian of mathematics who spent the last ten years of his career at the University of Toronto. The first May prize was awarded in 1989; to date there have been 12 winners. The recipient of the Prize also receives the May Medal, a bronze medallion cast from a design created by the Canadian sculptor Salius Jaskus. The **Montucla Prize** is an honour established in 2009 by ICHM to recognize research in the history of mathematics. The prize is awarded every four years to the author of the best article published by an early career scholar in *Historia Mathematica* in the four years preceding the International Congress of History of Science and Technology.

The prize is named after the great eighteenth-century historian of mathematical science Etienne Montucla, one of the founders of the modern discipline of the history of mathematics.
