- Newsletter -- The IMU has decided to start a regular electronic newsletter designed to inform mathematicians worldwide about the IMU, important international events, developments in mathematics, and the like. The plan is to release an issue about every two months. This newsletter will be edited by Mireille Chaleyat-Maurel (Paris) who was instrumental in the publicity campaign for the World Mathematical Year 2000.

Currently, the IMU is preparing a mailing list for the first issue of the IMU newsletter. We plan to release it around September 15, 2003. In order to reach as many mathematicians as possible, we ask for your support. Could you provide us with the e-mail addresses (and possibly also the names) of the members of your society?

The IMU guarantees that these e-mail addresses will be used only for "newsletter purposes" as described above. We will provide a simple "unsubscribe mechanism" so that everyone who wishes to be removed from this international mailing list has an easy way to delete his or her entry.

It would be most convenient for us to obtain a text-file from you electronically that is drawn up as follows:

Each line of the file contains the data of one member, i.e. the name (optional) and the

e-mail address of the member. This means that each line could have the following appearance "name" <e-mail address> for example John Ball

This format is easiest for us, but if your member list does not match this form we will be able to handle it as well. Just let us know how your list is structured (if this is not obvious anyway).

The mailing list, the archive, and the technological infrastructure of the IMU newsletter will be hosted at Konrad-Zuse-Zentrum (ZIB) in Berlin. ZIB is also hosting the IMU website that is currently undergoing a significant update, see http://www.mathunion.org/for the first version of the new website.

Therefore, the 12th Edition of the World Directory of Mathematicians will be the last edition.

In order to make the final edition available to as many people as possible, the IMU, through the American Mathematical Society (AMS), will discount the price from US \$70.00 to US \$35.00 per copy (no further discounts apply).
