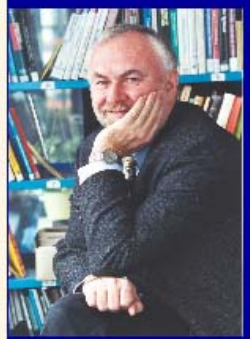

4. Facilitate and encourage the development of a Digital Mathematics Library (WDML)





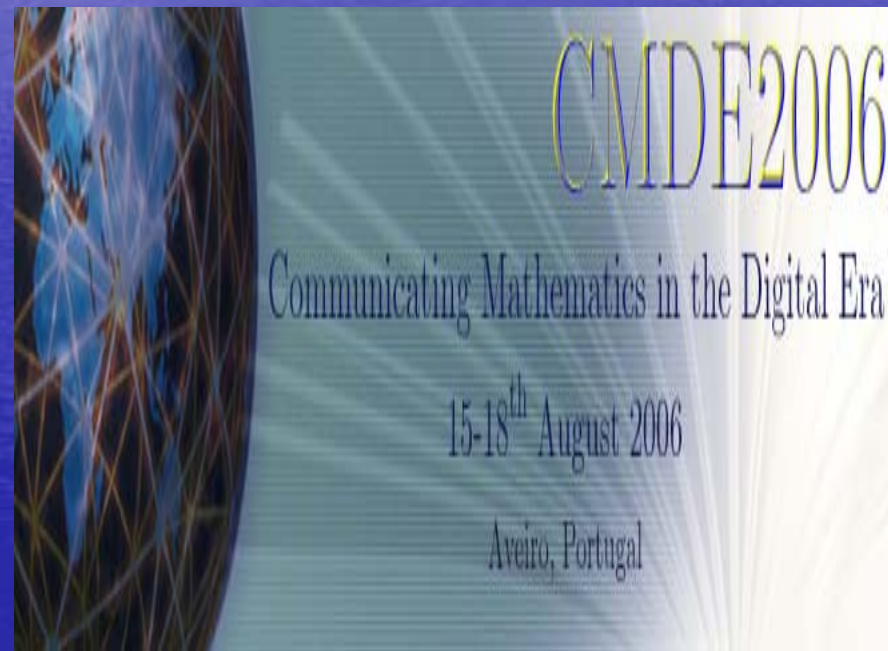
1. Forums and Meetings

3. FWDM

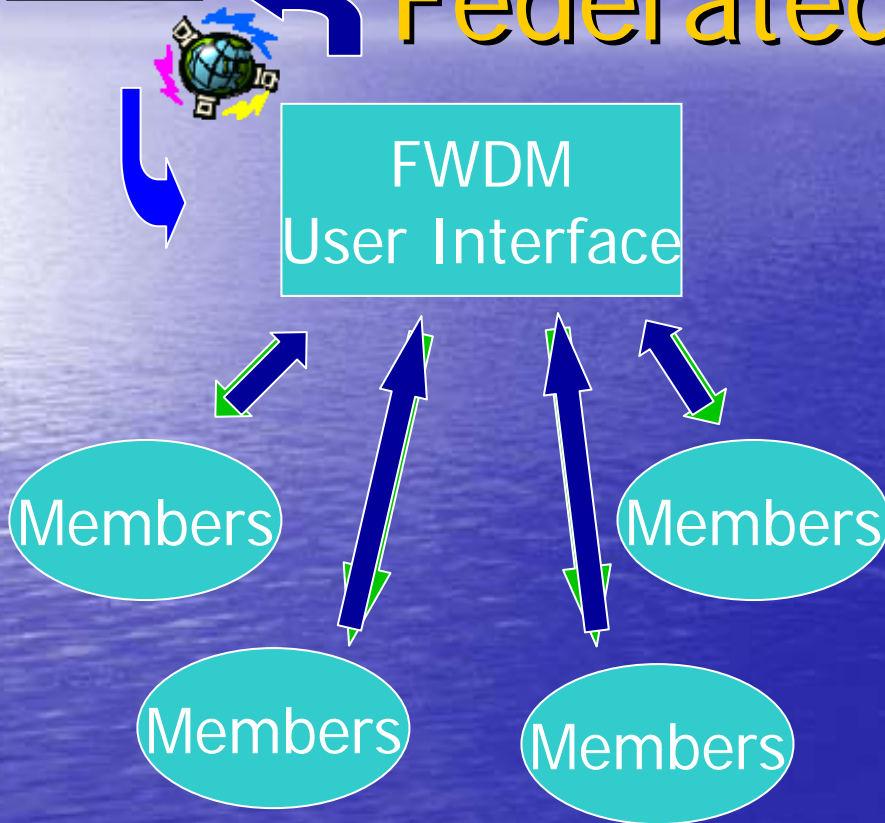
- Paper World Directory expensive
- Not as useful as electronic tool
- (Quickly out of date)
- 1998: EC asked CEIC to make recommendations
 - NEW IDEA





User

Federated Searching



- User requests information
- FWDM sends requests to search engines
- FWDM merges responses into single set of results
- Returns merged results
- No centralized database!

Some Best Practices for Retrodigitization

CEIC

29 June 2005

Mathematical research has been revolutionized by the availability of much literature on the internet. It is now commonplace to find papers published within the last decade as digital images that may be read or printed using an ordinary web browser. Older papers that were born in print are harder to obtain, but they may be made available by creating digital images from the printed pages.

This process of retrodigitization can potentially make the entire printed history of mathematics available to anyone with an internet connection.

The Registry

- Built on work of Ulf Rehmann
- Two purposes:
 - Provide complete list of (retro) digitized journals – with links!
 - Give scholars a way to “register” new projects
- Now lists 179 journals from 24 projects!
