SCIENTIFIC ACTIVITIES OF THE UNION

We summarize below the scientific activities of the Union since July 1976 :

 $\underline{\text{COLLOQUIUM}}$ ON MODULAR FORMS : held at Bonn University, July 2-14, 1976, on the topic :

Arithmetic properties of modular forms and modular curves, with emphasis on the case of <u>one</u> variable. This is a very active field to-day. The main subjects were :

- . rational points on modular curves,
- . relations between forms in 1 and 2 variables,
- . Galois representations attached to modular forms,
- . p-adic functions.

The Organizing Committee consisted in Professors F. Hirzebruch and D. Zagier, from Bonn University and Professor J.P. Serre, from the Collège de France, Paris. The main lecturers were : A: Ogg (Berkeley, U.S.A.), B. Mazur, J. Tate (Harvard, U.S.A.), N. Katz (Princeton, U.S.A.), O. Atkin (Chicago, U.S.A), A. Brumer (Columbia University, U.S.A.), together with the Organizers.

FOURTH INTERNATIONAL SYMPOSIUM ON TOPOLOGY : held in Prague from August 23 to 27, 1976.

Professor J. Novák was the chairman of the Organizing Committee which consisted of Professors Z. Frólik, J. Hejćman, M. Hušek, M. Katesov, V. Koutnik, V. Ptak, M. Sekanina, S. Schwarz, V. Tenkova.

The total number of participants was of 217 (164 from abroad and 53 from Czechoslovakia), representing 16 countries.

THe Proceedings of this Conference are going to be published in two volumes, one by ACADEMIA, Publishing House of the Czechoslovak Academy of Sciences, and another one by Springer-Verlag.

INTERNATIONAL SYMPOSIUM ON ALGEBRAIC GEOMETRY : this Symposium took place at the Research Institute for Mathematical Sciences of the Kyoto University, Kyoto, Japan, from January 10 to 14, 1977.

Professor M. Nagata was the chairman of the Organizing Committee. The support for this important meeting was decided at the 1975 meeting of the Executive Committee granting a sum of US Dollars 5,000- for travel expenses to foreign participants. The Union representatives were Professors E. Bombieri and C.S. Seshadri.

INTERNATIONAL COLLOQUIUM ON TOPOLOGY AND ALGEBRA : was held at the Eidgenössische Technische Hochschule, Zürich, from April 12 to 16, 1977.

The Organizer was Professor E. Specker, chairman of the Program Committee, and the Colloquium was dedicated to Professor B. Eckmann.

The total number of invited participants was about 40 and the main invited speakers were Professors Adams, Borel, Bott, Dold, Hirzebruch, Hilton, James, Kodaira, McLane, Milnor, Serre, Stallings, Swan.

The Union granted a sum of US Dollars 1,000- for travel expenses to foreign participants.

THE UPPSALA 1977 INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ON DIFFERENTIAL EQUATIONS, held from April 18 to 23, 1977, in connection with the 500th Anniversary of the University of Uppsala, and supported by this University, the Swedish Government and I.M.U. and sponsored by the Swedish Academy of Sciences and its National Committee for Mathematics. Professor Åke Pleijel was responsible for the Organizing Committee.

The particular aim of the Conference was to feature recent advances in the fields of Weyl's theory and its generalizations and the spectral problem for linear differential equations. This subject was broaden by taking up the related questions and other problems of general interest. Part of the Conference was devoted to applications in different fields.

The main speakers were Professors F.V. Atkinson, R. Conti, W.A. Coppel, A. Devinatz M.S.P. Eastham, W.N. Everitt, A. Friedman, J.K. Hale, H. Langer, B.M. Levitan, V.A. Marcenko, C. Olech, L. Pontrjagin, F.S. Rofe-Beketov, B. Szökefalvi-Nagy, J. Weidman, L. Lorch, R. Nevanlinna. The Proceedings of this Conference will be published in the Lecture Notes Series by Springer-Verlag.

INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ON THE MATHEMATICAL PROBLEMS OF THEORETICAL PHYSICS : was held from June 6 to 15, 1977 at the University of Rome (Italy). The Organizing Committee consisted in Professors G.F. Dell'Antonio, S. Doplicher, G. Gallavotti, G. Jona-Lasinio and one of the features of the Conference was to have comprehensive and advanced review talks, of about one hour to provide orientation and prespectives to younger workers in the wider interdisciplinary context of Mathematics and Physics.

Thus the following subjects were discussed :

Classical Mechanics and Field Theory, Quantum Field Theory, Dynamical Systems, Equilibrium Statistical Mechanics and Stochastic Processes, Non-Equilibrium Statistical Mechanics, Scattering Theory, Operator Algebras, Functional Integration.

The Conference was co-sponsored by IMU and the Istituto Nazionale di Fisica Nucleare.

INTERNATIONAL SYMPOSIUM ON ANALYSIS AND ITS APPLICATIONS, held at Ibadan, Nigeria, from June 25 to July 2nd, 1977.

The purpose of this Symposium was to bring together research workers in the West African countries working in the field of Functional Analysis and its Applications in order to identify areas of application of Functional Analysis and encourage cooperation among research workers.

The meeting had Instructional Lecture Series on the following topics :

INTERNATIONAL SYMPOSIUM ON APPROXIMATION THEORY, held at Campinas, Brazil, from August 1st to 6th, 1977.

The Organizing Committee was formed by S. Machado, L. Nachbin, J.B. Prolla, G.I. Zapata. There were 36 participants from Africa, America and Europe. Nineteen lectures were given by the following lecturers :

The Proceedings of this Symposium will appear late 1978 under the title "Approximation Theory and Functional Analysis", North-Holland Publishing Cy, Amsterdam.

INTERNATIONAL COLLOQUIUM ON UNIVERSAL ALGEBRA, held at Esztergöm, Hungary, from June 27 to July 1st, 1977.

This Colloquium was organized by the Janos Bolyai Mathematical Society ; the members of the Organizing Committee were : Pr. E. Tamas Schmidt, chairman, Béla Csakany, vice-chairman, Ervin Fried, Ferenc Gécseg, Andrãa Huhn, Lãszlo Lovasz, Istvan Németi, L.A. Skornjakov, Rudolf Wille.

110 participants gathered, 83 coming from abroad. 87 lectures were held and 8 invited speakers delivered plenary talks of one-hour each. They were : Professors Garrett Birkhoff (U.S.A.), Trevor Evans (U.S.A), Ernest G. Manes (U.S.A.), Jurgen Schmidt (U.S.A.), Alden F. Pixley (U.S.A.), Dimitri Matveevic Smirnov (U.S.SR.), Lev Anatolievic Skornjakov (U.S.S.R).

The rest of the lectures was divided into three sections : 1) pure universal algebra ; 2) special classes of structures ; 3) lattice theory. Applications to the theory of computing were included in Section 2.

INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ON DIFFERENTIAL EQUATIONS AND THEIR APPLICATIONS : "EQUADIFF IV", Prague, Czechoslovakia, August 22-26, 1977.

This Conference was the fourth in this series of EQUADIFF Conferences. The chairman of the Organizing Committee was Professor Jiri Fàbera, President of the Czechoslovak National Committee for Mathematics. Five invited lectures were given in plenary sessions by Professors O. Boruvka (Czechoslovakia), W.N. Everitt (U.K.), I. Marek (Poland), J. Necàs (Czechoslovakia) O. Oleinik (U.S.R.).

58 invited lectures and 157 communications were given in the following sessions :

1) - Ordinary Differential Equations,

- 2) Partial Differential Equations,
- 3) Numerical Methods and Applications.

The Conference gathered 354 mathematicians, coming from 23 different countries. The Proceedings of the IVth EQUADIFF CONFERENCE are published in two parts :

Part A : invited papers, by Springer-Verlag, Inc.

Part B : contributed papers, by the Society of Czechoslovak Mathematicians and Physicists.

INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ON COMBINATORIAL THEORY, Canberra, Australia, August 16-28, 1977.

The Organizing Committee was composed of : Dr. Jennifer Seberry, chairman, Dr. D.A. Holton (Deputy Chairman), Prof. B. Neumann, Mr. J.P. O'Halloran, Dr. C.H. Praeger, Dr. N.F. Smythe, Prof. P. Erdös.

Professors P. Erdös and E. Bombieri were IMU representatives.

This Conference attracted 89 participants, 26 coming from overseas. The invited speakers were : Professors J.A. Bondy (Canada), P. Erdös (Hungary), M. Hall Jr. (U.S.A), H. Hanani (Israël), F. Harary (U.S.A) D.R. Hughes (U.K.), R.C. Mullin (Canada), T.V. Narayana (Canada), J.N. Srivastava (U.S.A.), R.G. Stanton (Canada), W.T. Tutte (Canada), M.E. Watkins (U.S.A.).

The Proceedings of the Conference (invited lectures and instructional lectures) will be published by the Academy of Science presumably in conjunction with Springer-Verlag, Inc.

INTERNATIONAL COLLOQUIUM ON THEORY OF SETS, FOUNDATION OF MATHEMATICS was held in Beograd, Yugoslavia, from August 29th to September 2nd, 1977.

This Symposium was co-sponsored by the Matematicki Institut, Beograd, and I.M.U. The Organizing Committee was composed of Prof. D. Kurepa, chairman, V. Devidé, M. Stojaković, S. Presic, M. Durić, secretary, and the Program Committee was : Professors G. Kreisel, P.J. Cohen, A. Hajnal, I.L. Ershov, P. Vopenka, and the members of the Organizing Committee.

The aim of the Symposium was to get an insight into the present situation of the set theory and foundations of Mathematics and to point at the new directions of investigations in these fields. Within this framework, the areas of interest of the Symposium were various and divided into plenary and section plenary sessions with invited and contributed papers. Problem sessions, panel discussions and seminars were included in the program of this Symposium.

INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ON OPERATORS ALGEBRAS, IDEALS AND THEIR APPLICATIONS : Leipzig, D.D.R., September 25-28, 1977.

This Conference was organized by the Akademie der Wissenschaften der D.D.R. with the following Organizing Committee : Drs. H. Baumbärtel (Berlin), G. Lassner (Leipzig), A. Pietsch (Iena), and A. Uhlmann (Leipzig), K. Maurin and A. Pelczynski (Warszaw), M.K. Poliwanow (Moscow), L. Schwartz (Paris).

The I.M.U. representatives were Professors D. Kastler (Marseille, France) and B. Sz.-Nagy (Szeged, Hungary).

253 participants attended this Conference, coming from 22 different countries, and there were 107 participants from D.D.R.

Nineteen one-hour lectures were given in plenary sessions and 110 short 20-minutes lectures in the three sections, in an intensive and friendly working atmosphere.

The International Mathematical Union made a special effort in 1977 : world-wide sprading conferences as well as covering a large range of mathematical subjects, pure, applied and interdisciplinary. Following UNESCO's rules, the amount granted by I.M.U. for support to these conferences has been spent on travel expenses to foreign participants. Out of the above list, ICSU supplementary grant under UNESCO contracts helped in supporting the Ibadan Conference (Nigeria), the Rome Conference in June and the Conference "Equadiff IV", in Prague.

I.M.U. LECTURES :

I.M.U. sponsored a series of lectures given at UCLA, Mathematics Depactment, by Professor A.G. Vitushkin, on the invitation of Professor H.A.Dye, chairman, from April 14 to June 11. Professor Vitushkin's manuscript will be published in "L'Enseignement Mathématique" under the title "Representation of functions by means of superpositions".

EXCHANGE COMMISSION :

Professor Dr. Z. Semadeni, from the Polish Academy of Sciences, was able to visit different places in the South-East Asia under a grant of the Exchange Commission of I.M.U. on the occasion of his lectures at the S.E.A Conference in Manila, in May-June 1978.

Dr. Balasubramanian, from the Tata Institute of Fundamental Research, Bombay, spent a three-months period at the Mittag-Leffler Institute, from March to May, 1978, under an I.M.U. Fellowship grant.
