The Abel Prize Supporting Mathematical Research Worldwide

The Abel Visiting Scholar Program, funded by the Abel Prize and administered by the International Mathematical Union's Commission for Developing Countries (CDC), promotes international research collaboration by enabling mathematicians from developing countries to undertake one-month research visits with leading researchers and institutions worldwide.

The program strengthens research networks, enhances scientific capacity, and creates lasting collaborations that benefit both the individual researcher and their home institution.

Since its launch in 2013, the program has supported 40 visiting scholars from 18 different countries, who have carried out research visits to 15 different host countries.

The visits have fostered collaborations across Africa, Asia, Latin America, Europe, and North America, contributing to a more connected and inclusive global mathematical community.

- Grants of up to USD 5,000 support travel, accommodation, and living expenses for a one-month research visit.



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
